Experiencing the Advent



"And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." Luke 2:12

Over the course of history, man has come up with different ideas concerning Jesus. As the International Reformed Theological College is as close as the internet, these precious theological studies are available to leaders around the globe. But many who desire this Biblical training cannot afford it. We are praying that the Lord would raise up more individuals and churches to join our support team financially, prayerfully and even in spreading the word about the College.
