God is Doing New Things!

Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love. —Ephesians 4:15-16 (ESV)

With great joy we have previously announced new developments in our institution in 2020. What God has done throughout the years, and more recently, certainly is an answer to continuous prayers.

The significant increase in the number of new students, as well as the growth in course registrations has happened at the same time as an increase in the number of courses offered. In the second term we again have a record number of students and registrations! However, historically speaking, the presidential succession is new in a special way. It has never happened before and raises a variety of expectations.

In our last edition we expressed our deep gratitude to Rev. Ralph Boersema for the twenty years dedicated to the creation, development and growth of the IRTC around the world. In his new position as honorary President of the College, Rev. Boersema will continue teaching courses and advising the President and the Board of Directors. Now, we would like to introduce our new president, Rev. Ulisses Simões more closely, sharing a bit about his ministerial career and his vision for the next steps of our college.

Rev. Ulisses, tell us a bit about your ministerial life:

My first theological preparation was at the Seminário Presbiteriano do Norte (Northern Presbyterian Seminary), in Recife, during the last 4 years under the direction of Rev. Frans Leonard Schalkwijk. At this time, I was already married and working as an engineer. Besides him, I had the privilege to sit under Rev. Ralph Boersema, Rev. Pieter Meijer and Rev. Elias Medeiros, among others who were particularly important to my academic training. I pastored

the Presbyterian Church of Bahia, in Salvador as associate pastor, and then as senior pastor for a short time. While there, I lectured and even directed the then Presbyterian Institute of Bahia. In 1988, due to medical issues with my son, I transferred to Belo Horizonte; that same year I began teaching at the Presbyterian Seminary "Rev. Denoel Nicodemos Eller" (alongside of my pastorate). I served there as instructor, department coordinator, academic coordinator and lastly director. I stepped down last December 31st.

How did you become involved with the IRTC?

Back in 1985, on the porch at Prof. Ralph Boersema's house, while he was still a missionary in northeastern Brazil, we had a conversation about a certain model of distance theological education. In 1999, he honored me with the invitation to become part of the founding group of the association that created the IRTC, in 2000. Later I took part in the Board of Directors, of which I was moderator for several years. The IRTC ministerial project is one that I carry fondly in my heart and mind.

How do you view the potential of the IRTC, currently and for the next 20 years?

If this question had been put to me prior to the coronavirus pandemic, the answer would have been less clear cut; the pandemic has sharpened perceptions in this area. The IRTC has a history of being somewhat of a pioneer in its field in the Portuguese language. There are three pillars: online distance education in theology, emphasis on coparticipation of the local church, and a confessionally-Reformed framework. The coronavirus scenario ends up greatly strengthening the use of the internet in education. This is not different for theological education. The IRTC now has a much greater field of action to occupy.

Is there any part of the world the IRTC has not yet reached and could therefore bless through its work?

Certainly! The Portuguese language is one of the ten languages most spoken in the world, with approximately 250 million speakers. Among the Portuguese-speaking nations, I believe we have the challenge to establish ourselves in Angola, Cape Verde, Guinea Bissau, Equatorial Guinea, São Tomé and Príncipe, all in Africa and in East Timor in Asia. We could strengthen our presence in Europe as well. I believe we could help prepare workers for the evangelism of India from the province of Goa, which is a former Portuguese colony overseas; the same could happen with China, through Macau. I think the IRTC can carry out a similar relevant role in all continents, not only with Portuguese speaking countries as springboards, but also through Portuguese speaking Christians all over the world. The period in which we are living calls for this!


