

Education for Worship


The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight. – Proverbs 9:10 ESV

The IRTC Expands: Introducing Our New Faculty Members

The IRTC is pleased to welcome three new faculty members, reflecting our ongoing commitment to excellence in theological education aligned with the biblical worldview of the reformed faith. Our faculty is now composed of 49 part-time instructors, most of whom only teach one or two courses. These instructors will replace other cherished faculty members who have taught the below-mentioned courses up to this point, allowing them to focus on other ministerial duties.

Gabriel Araújo Zambon, an IRTC alumnus, starts his teaching career with a unique and valuable perspective. After assisting Rev. Ralph Boersema–one of the College's founders and Honorary President–for several years in teaching his *Oral Communication* course, Gabriel now takes over this responsibility. His apprenticeship under Rev. Boersema, combined with his background in administration, public management, and theology, has prepared him to inspire students to communicate effectively, an essential skill they will implement as they go on to ministry and theological teaching.

Márcio Roberto Alonso's specialized Old Testament studies provide him with a solid foundation for teaching *Biblical Geography and Archaeology*. His deep understanding of biblical lands and cultures will provide students with valuable insights into the historical and geographical context of the Word.

Wendell Lessa Vilela Xavier, with an extensive academic background in language and literature, philosophy, theology, and a doctorate in Portuguese, will apply his rich teaching experience to *Introduction to Applied Linguistics* (part of our Master's in Missiology) and *Portuguese I and II* (basic yet essential courses for effective written and spoken communication).
