When I went to Cape Verde as a missionary, I longed to study theology, but it seemed unfeasible. During a trip to Brazil, I was offered the opportunity to study, on the condition that I remain in the country. After prayer and counsel, I understood that I needed to return to Cape Verde.

Shortly before my return, I learned about the IRTC, but the cost was beyond my reach. Once back in Cape Verde, a friend offered to cover half the cost of a course, which encouraged me to take the first step. Later, I was surprised to receive a full scholarship for being the first IRTC student in Cape Verde. It was a clear confirmation that God knows our needs and acts at the right time.

Today, after completing my bachelor's degree, I am pursuing a master's degree in missiology. I give glory to God for the IRTC and for all the partners who make this ministry possible.
